QUICK FACTS

OUR PROFILE

In 2012-13, Correctional Service Canada's (CSC) expenditures totaled approximately \$2.6 billion. (Source: Departmental Performance Report – 2012-13)

CSC has over 17,000 employees, including:

- 7,700 correctional officers
- 2,500 parole and program officers
- 720 nurses
- 270 psychologists (Source: HR - Key Facts and Figures - 2014)

CSC manages and maintains:

- 43 institutions*
 - 11 Clustered Institutions
 - 2 maximum/medium/minimum security level units
 - > 9 medium/minimum security level units
 - 6 maximum security institutions
 - 9 medium security institutions
 - 5 minimum security institutions
 - 12 multi-level security institutions
- 92 parole offices
- 16 Community Correctional Centres
- 200+ Community Residential Facilities

AVERAGE ANNUAL COST OF AN OFFENDER

It costs over \$115,000 to maintain an offender in an institution, and over \$35,000 to maintain an offender in the community.

OFFENDER PROFILE

On a typical day during 2013-14, CSC was responsible for about 23,000 offenders, over 15,000 offenders in federal custody (including temporary detainees) and over 7,700 offenders in the community.

Of these offenders approximately:

- 20 per cent were serving sentences for homicide
- 14 per cent were sex offenders
- 25 per cent had a robbery conviction
- 20 per cent were serving sentences for drug offences
- 51 per cent had substance abuse issues
- 55 per cent had no high school diploma
- 11 per cent were associated with gangs and other criminal organizations

Of the over 15,000 offenders incarcerated:

- 23 per cent were serving life sentences
- 77 per cent were at various stages in fixed sentences
- 3 per cent were designated as dangerous offenders

MEASURING CSC'S PERFORMANCE

Comparing the 2013-14 fiscal year with 2009-10, federal offenders were less likely to:

- commit serious security incidents while in custody (from 0.81 to 0.61)
- escape from custody (from 31 escapes to 13)
- incur new violent offences while on community supervision (from 3.0 to 2.2) (Source: 2013-14 Performance Measurement Framework Year-End Results)
